# why we give

Jesus said: "Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moths and vermin destroy, and where thieves break in and steal. But store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where moths and vermin do not destroy, and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." —MATTHEW 6:19-21

### 1. IN RESPONSE TO GOD'S GRACE

We give financially not to alleviate our guilt, nor to earn our way before God, or a substitute for other forms of serving, but in response to God's extraordinary grace given freely to us. Our motivation for giving springs from God's generosity to us, especially that which we have seen poured out in Jesus.

### 2. BECAUSE ALL THAT WE HAVE BELONGS TO GOD

We give financially because we recognise that all that we have is from God and for God. If Jesus is Lord of all, then that must mean he also Lord of our resources. Deploying our financial resources cheerfully and generously helps us to remember that all we have ultimately belongs to the Lord.

### 3. GIVING HELPS GROW US AS DISCIPLES

We give financially because it helps as to grow as disciples. Jesus spoke about the danger of having an unhealthy relationship with money: that where our treasure is, therein also lies our heart! When we think that money is the solution to our problems or the ultimate security that we need, it can quickly become an idol. When we give sacrificially, it helps us to rely on—and enjoy—God's provision above material possessions. Giving matures us because it helps grow our dependence and delight the Lord.


### 4. TO INVEST IN GOD'S KINGDOM PURPOSES

We give financially because it is an investment in what truly lasts. Jesus compared giving to being like that of planting a seed. When we give to God's purposes, we trust that he takes our gift and multiplies it out to yield fruit for his Kingdom.



### our needs

The ministry and mission of our church is dependent upon our people's regular, generous, and sacrificial financial giving. In 2024, we need to significantly grow our regular giving in order to be able to meet our budget needs (and the ministry and mission activities which it funds).



Did you know? More than 80% of our income comes from the generosity of our people in the form of tithes and offerings. St Bart's is not funded by a central body nor do we have other income-generating assets (which is the case for some older or historic church centres). The other 20% of income relates to events program cost.

# CURRENTLY: THE EQUIVALENT OF 46% OF MEMBER HOUSEHOLDS REGULARLY GIVE.

Whilst we don't track who gives, we do know that currently there are around 151 households that regularly give. This represents around 46% of member households.

### WE NEED TO GROW GIVING

To meet our budget, we need to grow the number of households giving to at least 55%. This means adding ~25 new regular givers.

## how to give

REMEMBER THIS: WHOEVER SOWS SPARINGLY WILL ALSO REAP SPARINGLY, AND WHOEVER SOWS GENEROUSLY WILL ALSO REAP GENEROUSLY. EACH OF YOU SHOULD GIVE WHAT YOU HAVE DECIDED IN YOUR HEART TO GIVE, NOT RELUCTANTLY OR UNDER COMPULSION, FOR GOD LOVES A CHEERFUL GIVER.

### 2 CORINTHIANS 9:6-7

**SACRIFICIALLY.** The New Testament approach to giving is not a set percentage (e.g., 10%), but giving sacrificially out of what God has entrusted to us. 10% could be too much for some and too little for others.

**PRAYERFULLY & THOUGHTFULLY**. We do not give under pressure, but with intention and prayer. Consider the table below to reflect on your giving.

**CHEERFULLY**. We count it as a great joy—and profound privilege—to give. Our giving is not only a participation in God's Kingdom work, but also helps us joyfully to grow in our dependence on him.

**REGULARLY**. Whilst it doesn't have to be *every week* (many give fortnightly or monthly), regular giving helps to ensure the consistency of resources to fund ministry and mission. Regular giving is also a helpful discipleship rhythm.
